**MOTION MEMBER BRAAKHUIS C.S.**

Proposed April 25, 2012

The Parliament,

having heard the deliberations,

putting on record that according to the Centre for Research on Multinational Corporations (SOMO) and the India Committee of the Netherlands (ICN) young girls are still being exploited for the production of textiles in India and that also garment companies that are active on the Dutch market are using ‘wrong textile’;

considering that child labour and exploitation should be tackled;

requests the government, in co-operation with the garment sector, to reach an agreement about full supply-chain transparency and the eradication of child labour in the textile chain and to inform the Parliament the results thereof;

and returns to the order of the day.

The motion was – on 26<sup>th</sup> of April 2012 - supported by the Christian Democrats, GreenLeft, Social Democrats, Socialist Party, ChristianUnion, Democrats66, Political Reformed Party, the Member Brinkman and Party for the Animals.
